Noam Rappaport once stated that he is interested in “what happens when two things are related to each other. The relationship becomes the third thing.”

In practice: two canvases join to make a single piece, found objects fix to a painted surface; or even, categories of painting and sculpture themselves, muddle.

Rappaport’s language, in its shaped canvases, luminosity, colorism, geometry, and humour, draws from an idiosyncratic canon of modernist painting.

Yet despite these affinities with the past, his work remains stridently contemporary and singular, pushing composition and formal balance to the edge of a precipice.
